Entrepreneurship Development (EDC-FHSSLA) SMU

Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) in the Faculty of Humanities, Social Sciences and Liberal Arts has been formed considering the importance of entrepreneurship. The main objective of the EDC is to encourage students to take up business projects and upgrade them to become successful entrepreneurs in future. EDC will also act as the pre-incubation centre for many budding entrepreneurs. The entrepreneurship cell started in 2017 to encourage B.com students to take up business projects as part of their curriculum and course but later got an official recognition on 19th December 2019 by the Certificate of Establishment and approval from Registrar office (No.118/SMU/REG/00/146/2019).

The main roles of EDC in SMU are as follows:

- 1. To encourage students to take up business projects and help them create viable business plans and reports.
- 2. To conduct lecture series through *Let's Talk* platform (an initiative of EDC). Various Local, regional and national entrepreneurs are invited for a talk and interaction with students.
- 3. To encourage students to take up research related to entrepreneurship.
- 4. To create industrial contacts to develop mentor and mentee relationships.
- 5. To conduct webinars, seminars and workshop.

Future roadmap

The EDC's main objective is to encourage and motivate students to take up business projects. In future, the main concepts are about creating a connection between local and regional investors and local entrepreneurs and help them scale their businesses at national and international levels. This will add value and volume to the local capital and also create an easy access to capital for local entrepreneurs. Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) consists of members from faculties, students and experts from the regional ecosystem.
