

CELEBRATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING

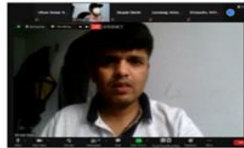
26 June, 2021: The international day against drug abuse and illicit trafficking is observed every year with the aim to create awareness about issues related to drugs

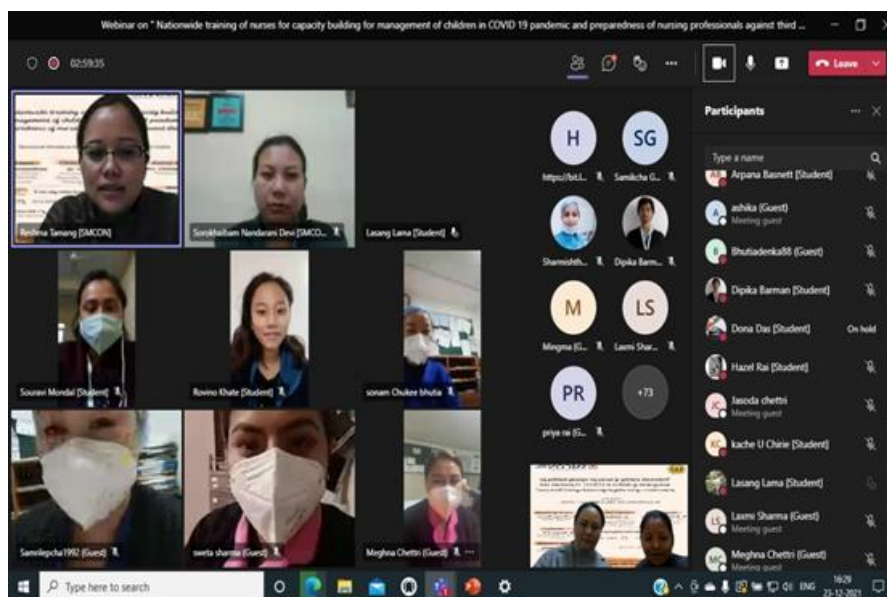
“Nationwide training of nurses for capacity building for management of children in COVID-19 pandemic and preparedness of nursing professionals against third wave”

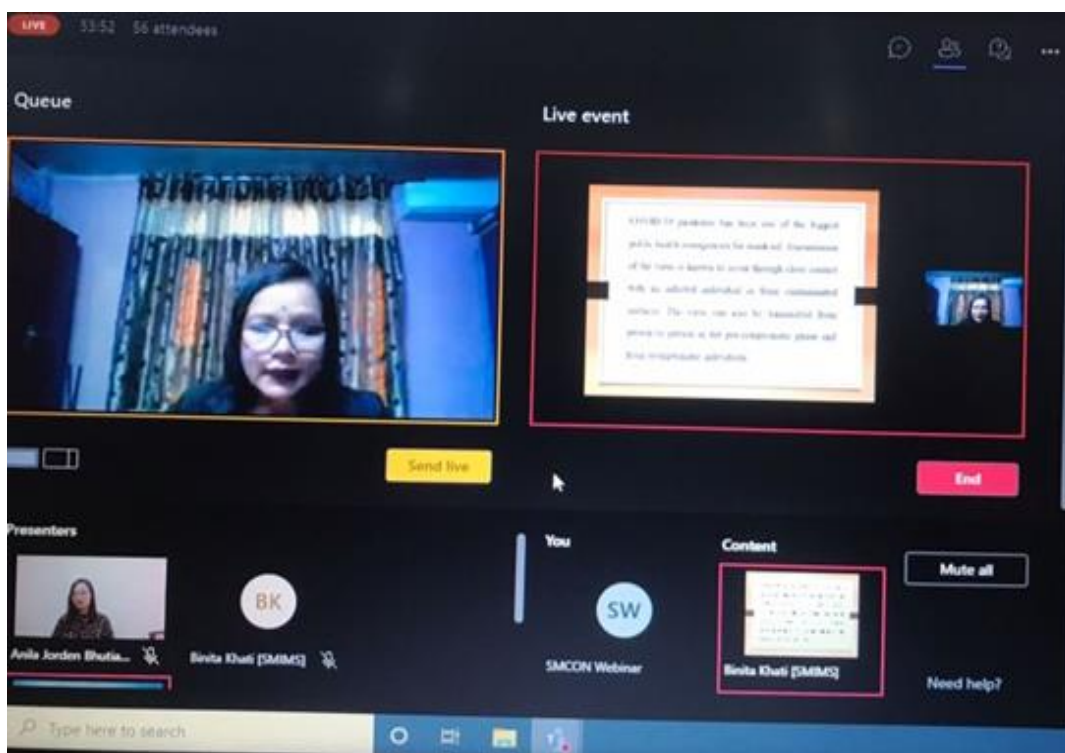
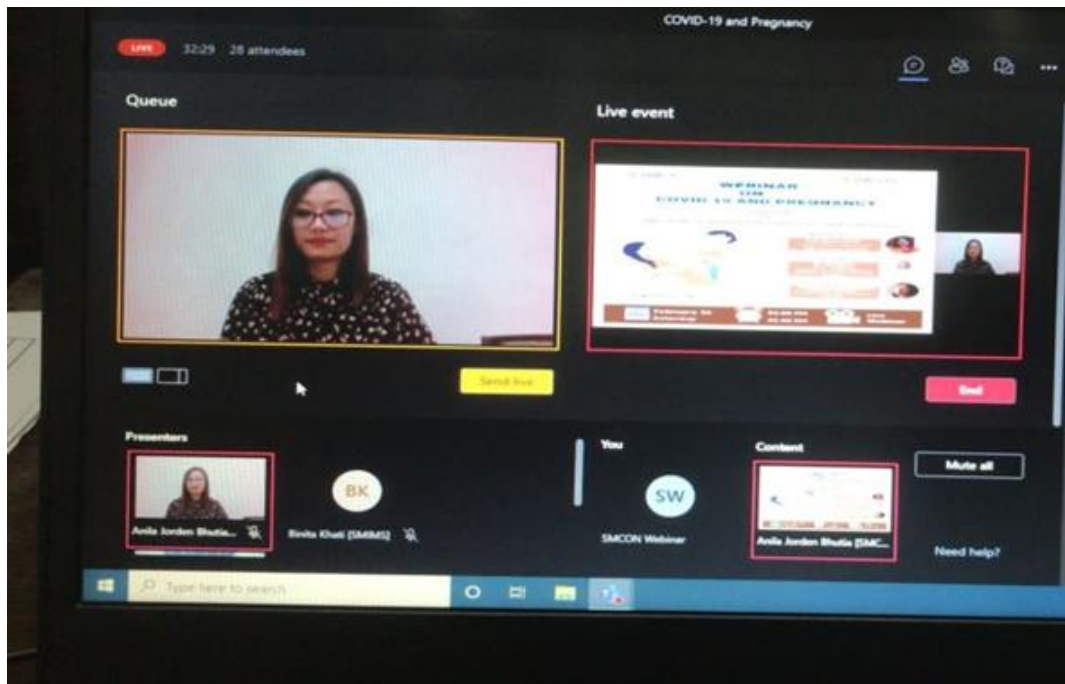
COVID 19 AND PREGNANCY 2022
