Margadarshan Scheme Quality promotion initiative

Introduction

National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was established in 1994 as an autonomous institution of the University Grants Commission (UGC), with its Headquarters in Bengaluru, Karnataka. The mandate of NAAC is to make quality assurance as an integral part of the functioning of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and to motivate them to build a strong quality culture within.

Vision of NAAC

To make quality the defining element of higher education in India through a combination of self and external quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance initiatives.

The mission statements of NAAC are

- To arrange for periodic assessment and accreditation of institutions of higher education or units thereof, or specific academic programmes or projects;
- To stimulate the academic environment for promotion of quality in teachinglearning and research in higher education institutions;
- To encourage self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations in higher education;
- To undertake quality-related research studies, consultancy and training programmes,
 and
- To collaborate with other stakeholders of higher education for quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance.

These mission statements aim at translating the NAAC's vision into focused action plans, and define NAAC's engagement with Higher Education Institutions for ushering a quality culture in them. Striving to achieve its goals as guided by its vision and mission statements, NAAC primarily focuses on assessment of the quality of higher education institutions in the country. The NAAC methodology for Assessment and Accreditation is specifically designed taking into account the good practices of Quality Assurance (QA) agencies across the world and consists of an initial self-assessment by the institution and a subsequent external peer assessment organized by NAAC.

About Margadarshan (Mentor - Mentee) Scheme

As per mandate of NEP, NAAC has launched Margadarshan scheme for mentoring and handholding to accreditation aspirant institution to improve and instill Quality Assurance in Higher Education which is reflected in vision of NAAC.

Aim of the scheme

The scheme aims to bring all aspirant Higher Education Institutions in the fold of NAAC accreditation through handholding and mentoring.

Objective

- To improve overall quality of Higher education across the country through accreditation
- To Mentor non -accredited HEIs to volunteer for accreditation as desired in NEP.
- To tap regional potential through regional languages to enhance the number of accreditations in the country.
- To enable Government, rural and other HEIs to volunteer for accreditation.



Eligibility

- Mentor: Any higher Education Institution which has underwent subsequent cycles of accreditation and under RAF their latest grade is "A" and above with valid accreditation status or any other Government HEI with potential to mentor (for states not having A and Above grades.)
- Mentee: Any eligible HEI as per NAAC guidelines aspiring for accreditation can be a mentee. (Note-Mentee HEI should not have gone for NAAC accreditation earlier and wish to apply for first cycle.)

Guidelines

Role of Higher education department/SLQAC's and other authorities in state

 To encourage eligible HEI's (as per norms of scheme) to come forward either as a mentor or as a mentee and volunteer for accreditation.

Role of Mentor

- Chose HEIs which are aspiring to go for NAAC assessment and accreditation and, mentor
 them through hand holding exercise (preference to be given to Government Institutions
 in disadvantages locations /geographically diversified area and others HEI in close
 proximity).
- Understand the problem of mentee HEIs and handhold them to get ready for accreditation.
- Mentee HEI to understand A and A process and guide them for documentation.
- Help mentee HEIs to register to create HEI portal and facilitate to submit IIQA.
- Guide in preparation of SSR and make them understand intent of metrics and SOP.

Help in preparing final report to be submitted to NAAC by mentor HEI.

Submission of report

After successful completion of the scheme mentor HEI must submit detailed report to NAAC to review the performance of the mentee HEI endorsed by head of the mentor institution and NAAC officer.

Terms and conditions

- Duration of scheme is for three months to reach the target.
- A university sanctioned with Margadarshan grant of one Rs. One Lakh has to mentor and bring in six HEI's in fold of accreditation within three months.
- Affiliating /Autonomous Institution sanctioned with Margadarshan grant of Rs.
 Fifty thousand must bring in three HEI's in fold of accreditation within three months.
- If for any reason, the mentoring institution is not able to complete the mentoring process, until successful accreditation of the mentioning institution, the share of second installment fee shall be foregone.
- The financial assistance to be utilized exclusively for the purpose of mentoring and not for creating infrastructure or any other facilities in Institution.
- Mentoring HEI has to keep the concerned authorities of NAAC updated about the activities carried out in the Margadarshan - Quality Promotion Initiative by my institution.
- If any violation found on the part of mentoring institution, Mentroing HEI shall be liable for appropriate actions from NAAC.
- Mentor HEI should sign MoU with mentee HEI for the purpose and the copy of the same should be attached with the proposal.




