Slide 4:

- Literature survey (for Format See NEXT PAGE)
- (a) A brief list of important papers/articles/surveys/books/reviews etc. referred for last six month's work.
- (b) Degree of motivation achieved from these references to carry out last six month's work.

Slide 5:

- Summary of the last Progress Review.
- (a) Slide of proposed work as shown in last Progress Review.
- (b) Work done during last six months (Course work/ Seminar/Design & Development etc.). It may be more than 2/3 pages

Slide 6:

• Work done during last six months (Course work/ Seminar/Design & Development etc.).

Slide 7:

- Publication/ Acceptance of paper(s), if any along with the name & publisher of the journal.
- Attending Conference (s)/Workshops/ Presenting Conf. paper(s)/Visiting external experts/ working at national labs.

Slide 8:

- Proposed work for next six month
